


WORCESTER

WORCESTER CATHEDRAL

Worcester Cathedral, with its magnificent stained glass windows, is open seven days a week with free entry. The building presents a magnificent sight as it rises majestically above the River Severn. The Cathedral's fascinating history is visible throughout the building. A tour is certainly worth taking to discover all the secrets hidden within this remarkable venue.

Only a 11 min walk from the River Severn
